

## SCORING A DIVISIONAL DIVING CHAMPIONSHIP MEET

How many people are needed @ the table.....

### 1 ANNOUNCER

- At the beginning of the meet, announce the order of diving to include the divers name and the team they are from.
- After the initial announcement of divers, you may use first names only, unless there are 2 or more of the same first names. Then use the first name and team.
- Announce first name of diver, number of dive, position and degree of difficulty. Then announce who is "on deck."
- Announce the scores after each dive.
- At the beginning of each round, announce the round, (2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or final round.),
- At the end of the last diver of the meet, announce, "this concludes the diving."
- Announce the results of each age group from last place to first place.
- **Then announce** "*if the winner cannot attend the All Star Meet, the coach should notify the scorers table immediately, so the second place diver can be informed that he/she shall be representing the division at the All Star Meet.*"

### 4 SCOREKEEPERS

- 1 person to fill out the diving sheet with awards (scores) from judges.
  - √ *EXAMPLE: Judges award first diver 5, 4, & 4*
- Same person adds awards from judges and records totals
  - √ *EXAMPLE: 5 + 4 + 4 = 13*
- Same person records numbers from person in charge of the diving calculator
  - √ *EXAMPLE: 13 x 1.5 = 19.50 (awards x degree of difficulty = total score)*
- Same person adds all dive totals to get a grand total
  - √ *EXAMPLE: 19.50 (dive #1 score) + 22.50 (dive #2 score) + 10.50 (dive #3 score) + 20.50 (dive #4 score) = 73 (grand total)*
- 1 person to use the diving calculator & add scores announced
  - √ *EXAMPLE: set diving calculator to degree of difficulty of dive (1.5) then add up the judges' awards 5 + 4 + 4 = 13. Slide the calculator to 13 and read number (should be 19.50)*
- 1 person to record judges awards only
- 1 person to record the places of each diver per age group by team, then add those scores to determine the overall team placings (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> etc.)

### 1 RIBBON WRITER

- To fill out awards once the places have been determined.

## SCORING A DIVISIONAL DIVING CHAMPIONSHIP MEET (continued)

### **HOW MANY JUDGES TO USE FOR DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS:**

- Use 4 or 5 judges, depending upon how many teams are participating in the division.
- In a division where there are 4 judges, the coach of the team whose diver is performing the dive, does not put up a score.
- In a division where there are 5 judges, throw out the high and the low score to equal a total of three scores.
- In a division where there are 6 judges, the coach of the team whose diver is performing the dive, does not put up a score **and** you throw out the high and low score to equal a total of three scores.

### **Entries:**

- Each Club may enter 1 diver per age group
- A diver cannot dive in both age groups

### **Scoring:**

#### Divisions with 6 Teams (DIVISION 2)

Individual events: 7, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1

#### Divisions with 5 Teams (DIVISION 1)

Individual events: 6, 4, 3, 2, 1

#### Divisions with 4 Teams (DIVISION 3 & 4)

Individual events: 5, 3, 2, 1

#### Divisions with 2 Teams (DIVISION 5)

Individual events: 4, 2

It is very important that all divers are present at the All Star Meet.  
Every effort should be made to make sure the second or third place athlete is notified  
in the event the winner of each event cannot attend.  
A good idea is to have a brief coaches meeting at the beginning of the meet.
